Sr. Sara Butler, MSBT will lead the discussion.

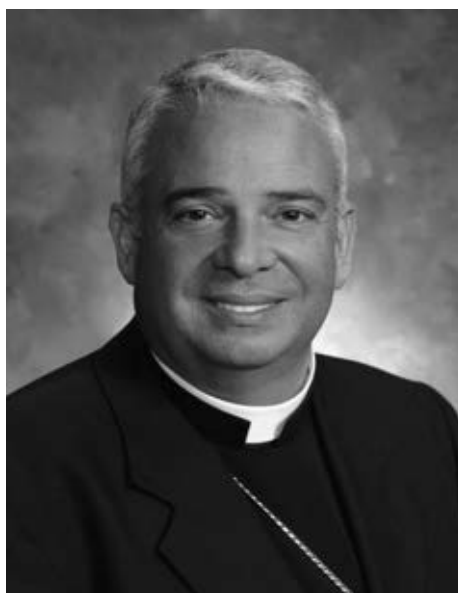

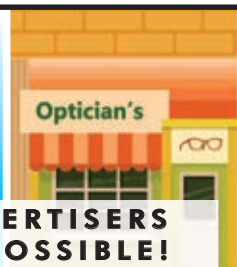
