The Institute for Christian Formation in the School of Theological Studies of Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary is a non-credit, non-degree, program for the continuous development of men and women in the life of faith. Catholic candidates for the Institute for Christian Formation, over the course of two years, are mentored to deepen an understanding of the gifts of Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist.
