# ARCHDIOCESAN OBSERVANCE OF THE YEAR OF SAINT JOSEPH

## DECEMBER 8, 2020 to DECEMBER 8, 2021

Marking the 150th Anniversary of the Proclamation of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church Every parish, institution, school, religious education program and religious community is asked to plan to observe in their own way the Year of Saint Joseph. The following guidance is provided to assist in the development of local observances. Please check the archdiocesan website for the Year of Saint Joseph for additional information, http://archphila.org/joseph/.

Pope Francis, in his Apostolic Letter, Patris Corde, for the Year of Saint Joseph, highlights the unique role of Saint Joseph in the life of the Church:

The Son of the Almighty came into our world in a state of great vulnerability. He needed to be defended, protected, cared for and raised by Joseph. God trusted Joseph, as did Mary, who found in him someone who would not only save her life, but would always provide for her and her child. In this sense, Saint Joseph could not be other than the Guardian of the Church, for the Church is the continuation of the Body of Christ in history, even as Mary's motherhood is reflected in the motherhood of the Church. In his continued protection of the Church, Joseph continues to protect the child and his mother, and we too, by our love for the Church, continue to love the child and his mother (Patris Corde, n. 5).

Above all, the Year of Saint Joseph, invites all the members of the Church to recognize the unique role of Saint Joseph as the Patron and Protector of the Universal Church. The Holy Father's Apostolic Letter further invites the members of the Church "to increase our love for this great saint, to encourage us to implore his intercession and to imitate his virtues and his zeal (cf. Patris Corde)

# THREE PILLARS TO THE OBSERVANCE OF THE YEAR OF SAINT JOSEPH

"To increase our love for this great saint" • Priests and deacons are encouraged to preach on Saint Joseph when fitting. • Reflection and study groups on Saint Joseph are encouraged in parishes and other settings. • The Consecration to Saint Joseph is especially encouraged during the Year of Saint Joseph. Please see the website, http://archphila.org/joseph/, for materials to assist with this pillar. "To encourage us to implore his intercession" • Promote the traditional prayers to Saint Joseph, including the Litany of Saint Joseph, to be prayed in common and in the family. • A Prayer to Saint Joseph may follow the Prayer to Saint Michael outside of the celebration of Mass. • Promote the celebrations of the liturgical feasts and devotions to Saint Joseph: o The Solemnity of Saint Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary (March 19), and the Memorial of Saint Joseph the Worker (May 1). o Arrange for devotions to follow or precede Mass on the 19th of each month and Wednesdays of each week (the day of Saint Joseph). o Make use of the Votive Mass of Saint Joseph in the Roman Missal when permissible, especially on the 19th of the month and on Wednesdays. Please see the website, http://archphila.org/joseph/, for materials to assist with this pillar. "To imitate his virtues and his zeal" • Study and promote the practice of the virtues of Saint Joseph, especially prudence, obedience, iustice, patience, fidelity, courage and chastity. • Promote the Corporal Works of Mercy in honor of Saint Joseph. • Promote the Consecration of daily work in honor of Saint Joseph. • Promote the formation of boys, young men and adult men according to the pattern of masculinity and fatherhood found in St. Joseph.
