



February 17th is Ash Wednesday. Ashes will be given out at the 8:00 a.m. mass and the 7:00 p.m. mass. Catholics who are over the age of 18 and under the age of 60 are required to fast, which means that they can eat only one complete meal and two smaller ones during the day, with no food in between. Catholics who are over the age of 14 are required to refrain from eating any meat, or any food made with meat, on Ash Wednesday.



This year ashes will be distributed differently from in the past due to the pandemic. When you get in line, follow the spacing marked out on the floor, ashes will be applied by using a cotton ball. It is the most hygienic way to distribute the ashes.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS will begin on Wednesday, February 24th at 7:00pm and every Wednesday thereafter during Lent followed by Benediction. During Holy Week Stations will be held on Good Friday at 7:00pm.



CONFESSION

During the season of Lent, we would like to emphasize the importance of Confession. We will have Confessions as always during our regular schedule: Saturday at 3:00pm, Sunday 30 minutes before Mass. During Lent, we will also have Confessions after Stations of the Cross.
