The feast was set by Pope John Paul II in 2000, following Jesus' request of Saint Faustina.

For starters: what do we mean by Divine Mercy Sunday? "Divine Mercy" is the term used for <u>God's infinite love</u> <u>when it touches us our troubles and our struggles</u>, of every and any kind.

Concerning Divine Mercy Sunday

The most comprehensive revelation can be found in Saint Faustina's diary entry 699: My daughter, tell the whole world about my inconceivable mercy. I desire the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls. and especially poor sinners. On that day, the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My Mercy.

The soul that will go to confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day are open all divine floodgates through which graces flow. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be scarlet.

My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom throughout all eternity. Everything exists has come from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to me will contemplate MY love and mercy throughout eternity.

The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the fount of My mercy.

One important note: attaining plenary indulgence to remit all temporal punishment due to sin requires a person to be free of "all attachment to sin, even venial sin". Many consider this to be very difficult. On the other hand, attaining the graces of Divine Mercy Sunday has no such requirement. Through these graces, you can "obtain forgiveness of sins and punishment", and not be overly concerned about any lingering attachment
