## **CATHOLIC CHARITIES APPEAL**

Good afternoon / morning. I would like to speak today about the Catholic Charities Appeal. Let's begin by comparing two quotations.

At the Last Supper, Jesus says in St. John's Gospel (13:34-35):

I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.

Compare that with what a friend said to me recently. "I wish the Church would stop asking for money."

Let's think about that. What would happen in the Archdiocese if the Church stopped asking for contributions to the Catholic Charities Appeal? Or what if there was a Catholic Charities Appeal and no one contributed? Just last year . . .

THE POOR: 1.2 million meals were not served last year at homeless shelters, afterschool and residential programs for youth, and programs serving persons with intellectual disabilities.

51,000 households did not receive food & groceries.

**206,000** items of clothing were not given to the homeless and families in need.

**409** clients in 7 residences for the homeless (such as St. John's Hospice, Mercy Hospice and Women of Hope) would be without shelter or meals.

8300 day-guests did not receive meals, showers, and clothes.

**THE DISABLED**: **44** children with severe physical and intellectual disabilities could not live and be cared for at St. Edmond's Home for Children

**310** men and women with intellectual disabilities did not reside in the Don Guanella & Divine Providence campus-based cottages and 11 community group homes

300 similar adults did not get help in life-sharing and day program.

**FAMILIES IN NEED: 8** Family Service Centers did not exist in Philadelphia, Bucks, Delaware and Montgomery counties.

25,000 clients and family members did not benefit from social work, case management & referral assistance

**24,000** persons were not trained in life skills such as financial literacy, job search, prenatal care and parenting

**8.400** parents did not receive baby care items.

STUDENTS: 100 children were not educated in the Archdiocesan schools of special education

There would not be **8 sites** offering afterschool and summer programs.

2,700 children did not learn in specialized school or afterschool settings

ELDERLY: 296 seniors did not live in 5 affordable senior housing facilities

**5,800** seniors did not receive housing & community services, in-home support and recreation in 4 senior community centers and parish eldercare programs.

RETIRED PRIESTS: 121 priests did not receive needed care and support.

SUMMARY: A total of 640,000 individual lives were not positively impacted.

That is why the Catholic Charities Appeal asks for and needs your help. If you have already made a gift, thank you. Jesus's words at the Last Supper are echoed in a familiar hymn, "They will know we are Christians by our love, by our love. Yes, they will know we are Christians by our love."

This year's Catholic Charities Appeal asks each of us if "we love one another." It is up to each of us to answer.


