
Further, all persons 18 years of age up to and including their 59<sup>th</sup> birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full mean on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light. <u>These obligations are binding for meatless</u> <u>Fridays and Ash Wednesday.</u>

Remember to drop your Shoprite receipts in the container in the vestibule as you enter from the parking lot.








