MISSIONARY HUBS OVERVIEW -

DRAFT FOR FEEDBACK

WHAT IS THE VISION?

A missionary hub is an initiative that is connected to a parish or entity to ensure through staffing, programming, disciplines, and resources that the Church would be outward facing in that part of the diocese to bring souls to Christ.

The point of connection for all Catholic activity in an area and a comprehensive experience of parish life

Assessing the local needs of the people, matching as best as possible the language, cultural, accessibility needs and trying to find ways to partner to resource

At least 10 hubs established per county over the next 10 years

In current "ecclesial deserts:" Guaranteed center of Catholic Life for generations to come (giving certainty where there presently is none)

In areas currently with a lot of parishes: Dedicated place to welcoming those who currently don't practice, greater Emphasis on evangelization

HOW WILL IT BE STAFFED?

Outward facing, missionary-minded clergy and lay leadership with the pastor as the primary animator and leader (when in a parish setting). These priests have indicated a desire to serve in a missionary hub. **In each missionary hub, the clergy assigned would be:**

Full-Time, resident priest pastor – In ecclesial deserts, it is expected that the pastor will focus about 70% of his time on missionary activity, in more established areas, 50% on missionary activity

Full-Time, resident parochial vicar – in ecclesial deserts, it is expected that the pastors will focus about 70% of his time on missionary activity, in more established areas, 50% on missionary activity

Senior/retired priest in residence -(100%) on pastoral care) - based on the openness and desire of the priest

1-2 permanent deacons – based on the gifts and time availability of the deacon in discernment with the pastor

In addition to the present staffing at a parish, a

missionary hub would also have the following lay leaders:

1 Full-time Director Missionary Hub Operations

- 2 Full-time Missionaries focused on relationship and accompaniment
- 1 Full-time Communications Role

1 Full-time Volunteer Service Coordinator

In each county, the missionary hubs would be supported by:

1 concierge role that helps individuals navigate archdiocesan resources

Go-to representatives for emerging ethnic communities

Presence of some apostolic movements or apostolate associated with evangelization

Intercessory prayer community/contemplative and sacrifice support

While the missionary hub staff should be primarily working out in the field, if the current office space is not sufficient, the Office of Strategic Planning will assist in resolving the issue.

WHAT WILL HAAPEN THERE?

PREACTICES, ACTIVITES, PROGRAMS

Implement targeted outreach and programming to specific subsets of the population (e.g. Post-Cana, Post Jordan strategy, Post-Baptismal Catechesis/Mystagogy, bereavement)

Cadence of prayer for hub leadership that is open to the community

Host activities in rectory, homes, "third spaces"

After-hour schedule for parish office/communication

Parent options during children's activities, children options during parent activities

Up-to-date communications strategy - text, web, social

Communication that goes out in multiple languages or can be translated
